Greetings

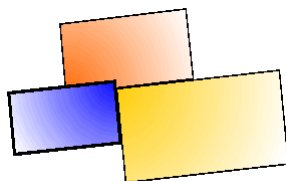

Hopefully we will have a great turnout for the February meeting, remember there will food for purchase and craft beers will be cold and flowing. Come early and enjoy the friendship and food.

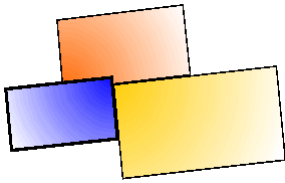

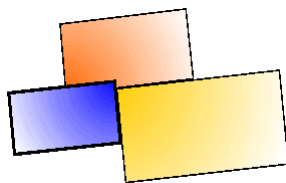
New Members

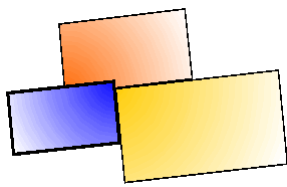

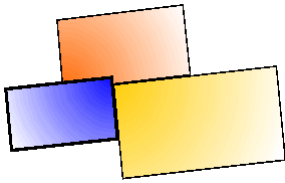

COPa Receives a Sponsorship from Northstar Chevrolet

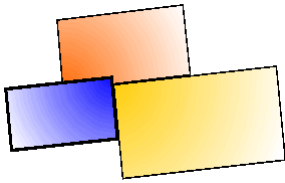

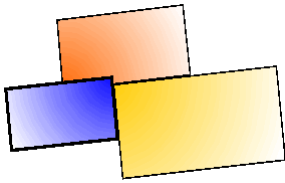
On the Road Again...

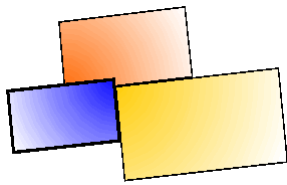
Each of the websites are informative and user friendly. Over the years, I've traveled to each of these facilities a few times a year to tire kick. I've even made a purchase or two.

In Memoriam – JR. Redden

April 30, 1940 - January 11, 2025

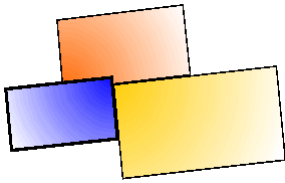
I met Junior and Sandy Redden under a canopy in front of our hotel on Woodward Avenue in August of 2015. This was my first trip to the Woodward Dream Cruise in Michigan, and the Reddens were invited by friends in the club. We made a quick connection as they were from McDonald, and I grew up in neighboring South Fayette. It did not take long to see that Jr had an interesting life with motorcross racing, Corvette restoration, and I likely saw him stock car racing at Heidelberg Raceway. I got to know him a bit later when they joined the club in 2016, and during my next trip to Woodward in 2017. We learned about Sandy's 550 hp '75 coupe with a C2 stinger with hood and side pipes, we were in awe of Jr's 1929 Rat Rod on a 4-wheel drive S-10 Blazer chassis with a turbocharged LS1 motor pushing "around" 900hp. Then, there is a 1984 Fiero, with what has to be a frightening 600 hp. Wait, one more, an 800 hp LS6 2003 Lingenfelter Corvette coupe.

Jr's Corvette restoration talent and knowledge was published in several national magazines - May 2016 and May 2017 in Vette Magazine, and April and September 2018 in Corvette Magazine. We have all 4 of the magazines in our Corvettes of Pa archives. His website, <https://reddenclassicrestorations.com/>, documents the many restorations and contains the magazine articles. A must read is the Green Hornet Project.

In addition to the memorable ride Ron Ring & I had in his rat rod going to dinner in Michigan, my other favorite story to tell about Jr started after a monthly meeting when I was President. Jr & Sandy were making a long trip from McDonald to Wright Chevrolet in Ambridge, where we were having our winter meetings in 2017 & 2018. I was always asking members for meeting ideas and input, and after one meeting, Jr said "Would you mind if I talked at next meeting about our World Record Bonneville Salt Flat car?" Wait?? What??? You have a World Record Bonneville Salt Flat car?

Jr was connected with Iron Dinosaur Racing in Etna, and their first year at Bonneville, set a world record in their class. So, now what do you do? Well, you build a completely new car, and Jr's knowledge of Chevrolet LS motors was utilized to power the car.

By constantly tinkering and working on repairs, Junior's mind looked for improvements and better ways of doing things. This is demonstrated by his invention, the J&J Safety hitch, which is a result of his many years as an over the road truck driver. <https://jjsafetyhitch.com/>

There were many stories involving racing motorcycles and stock cars, his Dad's land and involvement with the extension of Pittsburgh International Dragway to meet IHRA standards, and so many more. I often said, I wish I knew him earlier to hear more stories and the knowledge he had.

But I am grateful for the time I did spend with him, and they will always be remembered.

Our thoughts and prayers are extended to his wife of 52 years, Sandy, and their families. There will be a memorial car cruise on June 22, 2025, at the Red Fox Winery in Hickory PA. Details of time and information will follow at a later date.

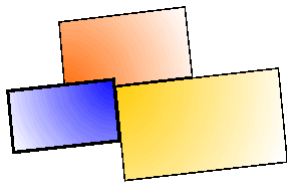

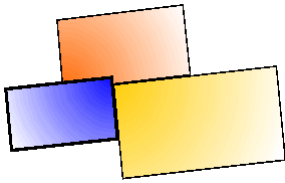

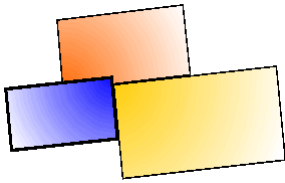
