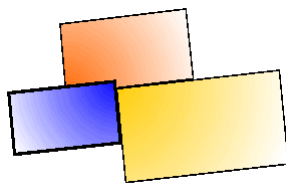

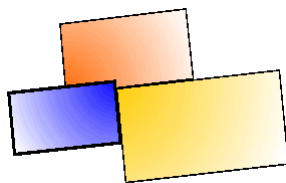

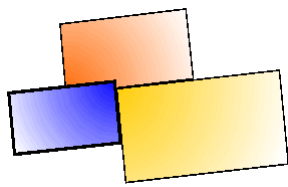
Currently we have 67 memberships with 122 members. We have added 11 new memberships with 20 members so far this year. Let's keep growing!

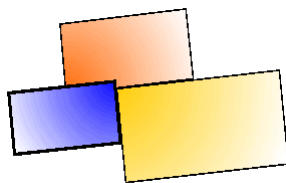

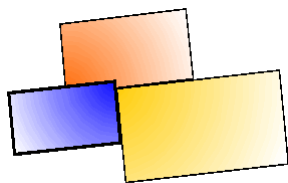

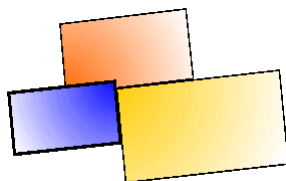

POKER RUN

On June 5, 2004, Jim Kinest from Corvettes of PA and Denny Prodrasky of North Pittsburgh Corvette Club jointly put together a poker run. Karen Coberly participated in the 2004 Poker Run and always said it was the most fun she had on a poker run. She was a big poker and card player/gambler. Jim Kinest suggested that we redo the poker run with North Pittsburgh and call it the Karen Coberly Memorial Poker Run. The route will be very close to the original 2004 route.

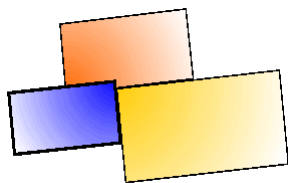
The Karen Coberly Memorial Poker Run is a fun event and is not timed, no need to speed! As you travel the route there will be three (3) stops where you will draw a card. You will also draw a card at the starting point and ending point. As you drive, you will also be asked to answer questions about things that you see as you enjoy the ride in the country! It's not mandatory that you answer the questions, but if you don't, you have no chance for a bonus card at the end.

At the ending point you may also be eligible for one or two bonus cards. The bonus cards can be combined with the issued cards to build the best five card poker hand. One bonus card will be awarded for bringing a sales receipt from the Cheese Factory, proving that you purchased at least one item at the Cheese Factory. This will not be a burden as the Cheese Factory is an amazing store and it's hard to walk out without buying food, drink or a novelty. A second bonus card will be issued to the person or persons with the highest number of correct answers to the questions. For instance, if five (5) people tie for the largest number of correct answers, all five (5) will be given a bonus card.

We will end the poker run at the Crooked Paddle restaurant, 13468 Hartstown Rd., Linesville PA 16424. This was the old Spillway Inn in 2004, where they issued the last card, had lunch and gave away prizes. We will continue the tradition and bonus cards and awards will be issued at the restaurant. It is not mandatory that you order food and drink here, but seriously, why not? Prizes will be awarded for the best five card poker hand, pick the best five (5) card hand from your issued cards and bonus cards.

Afterward, for those that are interested, we can stop and have ice cream at The Next Right Thing, Sweet Treats and Cool Eats, 202 Penn St, Lineville PA 16424 which is 0.7 mile away from the restaurant. You will need cash for anything you buy here; they do not take credit cards.

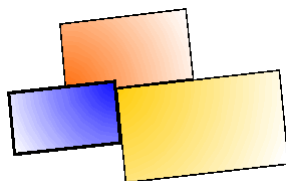
THE QUEST chronicles the beginnings of Corvette Racing at the famed Le Mans 24 Hour Endurance Race in France. Corvettes first appeared there in June of 1960. The film re-caps that historic race and what happened to both the Corvettes and their drivers.

Following the race, all the Corvettes were lost for decades. Collectors, restorers and enthusiasts came to recognize the historical significance of these cars, and an undercurrent of frantic searching for them was put into motion.

Corvettes at Carlisle co-founder Chip Miller set a personal goal of finding the 1960 class-winning #3 Corvette, acquiring it, and restoring it. Finally, he wanted to return it to Le Mans in 2010, with one of the original drivers, legendary racer John Fitch, to mark the 50th anniversary of the car's win. But a chain of heartbreaking events prevented Chip Miller from completing his vision.

THE QUEST reveals a series of sub-stories that all feed into the emotional tale of a son doing what he felt compelled to do in honoring his father's wish. Told by many of the people directly involved, THE QUEST uses archival materials to weave a story never told in its entirety...until now.

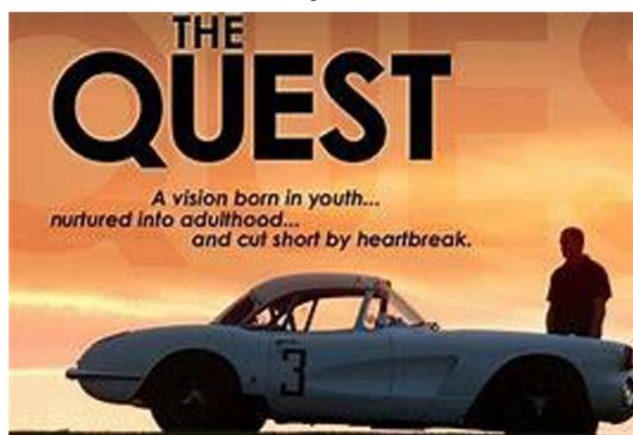

Four Corvettes raced at the 1960 24 Hours of Le Mans Endurance Race but the whereabouts of only three were known. Many decades later, Lance and Chip Miller of "Corvettes at Carlisle" decided to find the class winning #3 1960 Corvette and restore it to as raced condition. Depending on their success at finding and restoring the #3 Corvette, their ultimate plan was to return to Le Mans for the 50th anniversary of the #3 Corvette's historic victory with the car and one of the original drivers of the car.

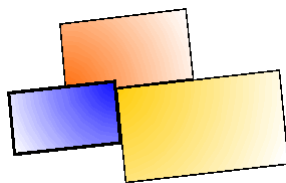

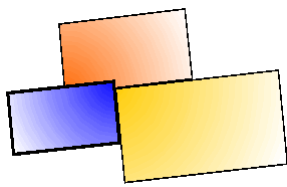

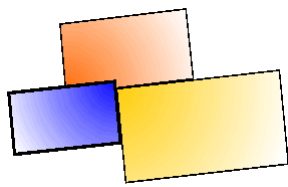
Introducing Daniel (Dan) Steele

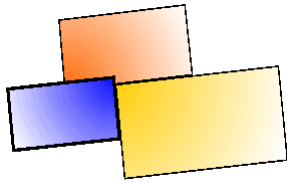
On the Road Again...

[Giant Cowboy in Kittanning](#)

If you are driving along Route 422 just east of Kittanning, you can't miss one of the most unusual roadside oddities in Pennsylvania: the Giant Cowboy.

Located outside of the [Cadet Restaurant](#) since 1962, this 30-foot cowboy known as Sam welcomes guests with a giant hamburger in his right hand. Interestingly, Sam was one of many characters made from the same mold in the 1960s. The first was a Paul Bunyan statue that was placed in Flagstaff, Arizona. The statues would be commonly seen outside of car shops holding a muffler and became known as a "Muffler Man." [Flying Saucer in Mars](#)



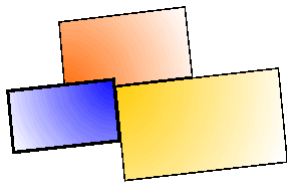

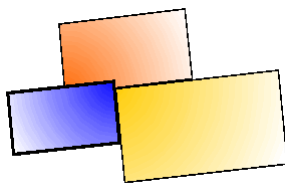
